Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$328 and \$733** is inside the band where half of all Ford F-150 fuel pump replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (access panel under the seat, pump only); above it is not automatically gouging (tank dropped with a full load of fuel, complete module with sender, filter replaced, diesel high-pressure pump) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Access panel or tank drop** — the single biggest labor difference between vehicles.
- **Module vs. pump** — the complete module (with sender and strainer) costs more than a bare pump.
- **Fuel level** — a full tank has to be drained first — time.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
