Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$177 and \$537** is inside the band where half of all Honda Odyssey power steering repairs landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (a return hose or o-ring and a top-up); above it is not automatically gouging (pump plus pressure hose, tight access on a transverse engine, full flush) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Hose or pump** — a hose is the cheap end; a pump on a crowded engine bay is the expensive one.
- **Flush** — contaminated fluid is often why the pump failed — a flush protects the new part.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
