Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$226 and \$521** is inside the band where half of all Nissan Altima brake pad replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (economy pads, hardware reused, no rotor service); above it is not automatically gouging (premium or OEM pads, rotors resurfaced, seized slide pins freed up) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Pad grade** — ceramic and OEM pads cost more than economy semi-metallic.
- **Rotor condition** — pads-only works when rotors are thick and smooth; otherwise it becomes a pads-and-rotors job.
- **Hardware and slides** — cleaning and lubricating the caliper hardware is what keeps new pads quiet.
