Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$268 and \$402** is inside the band where half of all Ford F-150 window regulator replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (aftermarket regulator on a common vehicle); above it is not automatically gouging (OEM assembly, glass off its track and re-secured, door with extra trim to remove) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **With or without motor** — most sell as one assembly now — more parts cost, less fiddling.
- **Door disassembly** — most of the price is opening the door up and putting it back right.

Vehicle **Ford F-150, model years 1977–2021**

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.

NOT A QUOTE This report describes what other owners paid for the same repair. Your year, engine, region and the parts chosen shift the number. FixDozer does not perform repairs and receives nothing from shops.

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
