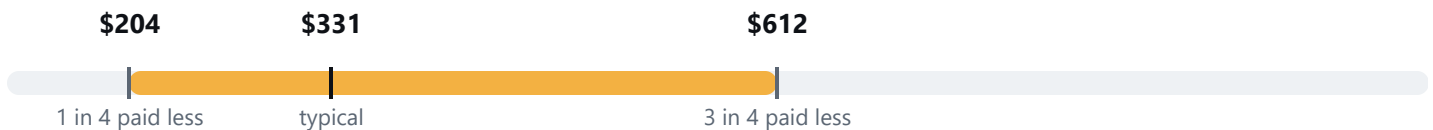

Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

### IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$204 and \$612** is inside the band where half of all Chevrolet Silverado 1500 brake line replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (one short section spliced in an accessible spot); above it is not automatically gouging (long runs along the frame, multiple sections, lines buried above the fuel tank or subframe) — but both ends deserve a question.

### WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **How much line** — a short section is cheap; a full run from master cylinder to rear axle is hours of routing.
- **Access** — lines above the fuel tank or subframe can mean dropping components to reach them.
- **Rust as a set** — shops that find one rotten line usually recommend inspecting the rest — the others are the same age.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.

**NOT A QUOTE** This report describes what other owners paid for the same repair. Your year, engine, region and the parts chosen shift the number. FixDozer does not perform repairs and receives nothing from shops.

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
