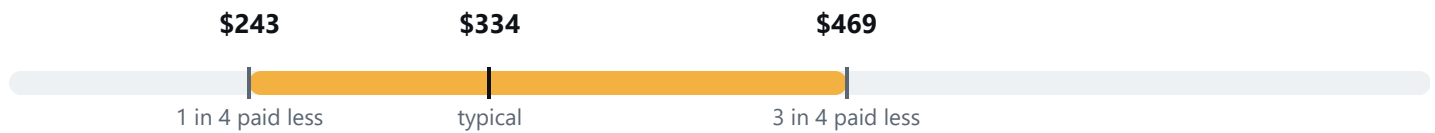

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Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$243 and \$469** is inside the band where half of all Chevrolet Cruze thermostat replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (a stand-alone thermostat with a gasket); above it is not automatically gouging (an integrated thermostat-housing assembly, coolant flush, access under the intake) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Thermostat or housing** — many newer engines sell the thermostat only as part of a plastic housing.
- **Access** — some are on top; some live under the intake.
- **Coolant** — a full refill with the specified coolant is part of the job.
