Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$207 and \$383** is inside the band where half of all Chevrolet Equinox VVT solenoid replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (one solenoid on top of the engine); above it is not automatically gouging (two or more solenoids, oil change with it, solenoids under the intake) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **One or several** — many engines run two to four; codes point to the one that failed.
- **Oil** — sludge is what sticks them — fresh oil usually comes with the job.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
