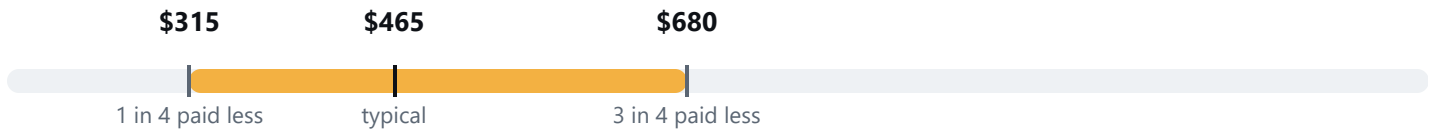

Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$315 and \$680** is inside the band where half of all Chevrolet Silverado 1500 shock and strut replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (rear shocks on a truck — bolt-on, no alignment); above it is not automatically gouging (front strut assemblies with mounts, alignment, air-suspension conversions) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Shocks vs. struts** — shocks bolt on; struts carry the spring and need an alignment afterward.
- **Complete assemblies** — pre-assembled struts cost more in parts but save labor.
- **Pairs** — always replaced per axle in pairs.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
