Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$432 and \$818** is inside the band where half of all Ford F-150 wheel bearing replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (bolt-in hub assembly on a truck); above it is not automatically gouging (pressed bearing needing the knuckle removed, OEM hub with integrated sensor, seized components) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Bolt-in or pressed** — hub assemblies bolt on; pressed bearings need the knuckle out and a press.
- **Integrated sensor** — hubs with the ABS sensor built in cost more but fix a warning light too.
- **Rust** — a hub seized to the knuckle adds time.

Source **paid invoices from independent US repair shops**

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.

NOT A QUOTE This report describes what other owners paid for the same repair. Your year, engine, region and the parts chosen shift the number. FixDozer does not perform repairs and receives nothing from shops.

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
