Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$154 and \$390** is inside the band where half of all Toyota Camry sway bar link replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (a pair of end links, easy access); above it is not automatically gouging (links plus bushings, seized hardware cut off, rear links behind the exhaust) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Links or bushings** — links are the usual culprit; bushings add parts and time.
- **Seized hardware** — rusted link bolts often get cut, adding time.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
