Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$221 and \$593** is inside the band where half of all Toyota Camry radiator replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (aftermarket radiator with hoses reused); above it is not automatically gouging (OEM radiator, hoses and thermostat replaced with it, vehicles with a transmission cooler in the tank) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **OEM vs. aftermarket** — aftermarket radiators are common and much cheaper.
- **While it's out** — hoses and thermostat are often renewed — cheap while drained.
- **Access** — some front ends need the bumper cover or fans out.

Data confidence **High** — *large sample, stable ranges*

Source **paid invoices from independent US repair shops**

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
