Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$144 and \$292** is inside the band where half of all Toyota Camry valve cover gasket replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (one gasket on an inline engine with clear access); above it is not automatically gouging (both banks on a V-engine, cover replaced because it's warped or cracked, intake removed for the rear bank) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Inline or V** — V-engines have two covers, and the rear one is often under the intake.
- **Cover condition** — warped plastic covers can't seal — replacing the cover costs more.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
