Low / typical / high are computed per line, so they don't add up exactly to the totals — the total row is the real distribution of complete invoices.

IS YOUR QUOTE FAIR?

A quote between **\$274 and \$432** is inside the band where half of all Toyota Corolla starter replacements landed. Below it is not automatically a bargain (remanufactured starter mounted in the open); above it is not automatically gouging (OEM starter buried under the intake manifold or exhaust, corroded cables replaced) — but both ends deserve a question.

WHAT MOVES THE PRICE

- **Where it lives** — on some engines the starter is right on top; on others it hides under the intake — that's the whole price difference.
- **New vs. remanufactured** — reman starters are common and much cheaper.
- **Battery and cables** — a good shop rules them out before selling a starter.

Bring it to the shop. Ask for the written estimate split into parts, labor hours and rate, and fees — then compare each line. A shop that explains a number above the range is doing its job; one that won't is telling you something too.
